Budget Vote and Trustee Election

Dear Neighbor,

Our community's enthusiastic participation in this past year's "50 Years on Franklin" Open House and READ poster campaign activities, combined with the many positive responses collected in our recent survey, tell us that The Pearl River Public Library is viewed as a vital resource for residents of all ages.

We are proud to be a part of a community that values its library. As we prepare for the future, we have initiated a strategic planning process to review the building facility to identify any areas of need. We also recognize the importance of expanding our digital and online offerings to provide the services necessary to remain relevant in the coming years.

On Tuesday, June 10, we are asking you to vote on the fiscal 2014-2015 Library budget. Based on current assessment figures, we expect that the homeowner with the average property assessment of \$200,000 would see as low as a **\$1.65 annual tax increase over last year.**

As trustees, it is our responsibility to secure adequate funding to support the Library. This year's proposed budget-to-budget increase is 3.3% with a projected total tax levy increase of 3.74%. The Board has made the decision to present a budget increase that exceeds the 1.46% tax cap rather than impose cuts that would force us to reduce hours of operation, discontinue providing popular materials and programs, or limit the availability of much utilized public meeting room space.

The Library Budget Vote and Trustee Election will be held on Tuesday, June 10, from 9:00am to 9:00pm in the Library's Pearl River Room. Absentee ballot applications are available at the Library.
